

Damp Mop Procedure

Product Needed: Mr. Clean Professional No-Rinse Floor Cleaner

Tools Needed:

- Wet floor sign
- Clean mop
- Mop bucket and wringer

Cleaning Frequency: Daily or more often, depending on soil levels

Preparation: Review MSDS, products labeling and caution statements. Choose appropriate safety equipment.

Special Directions for this Task: Start with a clean mop head and fresh solution. Clean the least soiled areas first. When finished, empty mop bucket, clean and return equipment to storage area. *Remove wet floor sign ONLY when surface is thoroughly dry.*

Step 1: Remove grit and loose soil on finished floor surfaces following the Dust Mop Procedure. On non-finished or grouted floor surfaces, use a broom or brush.

Step 2: Put out wet floor sign in area to be mopped.

Step 3:

- Fill a 4-gallon mop bucket to the fill line with warm water.
- Add 4 ounces of Mr. Clean Professional No-Rinse Floor Cleaner (1 oz per gallon)

***Note:** For heavy soil build-up, add 8 ounces of Mr. Clean Professional No-Rinse Floor Cleaner to a 4-gallon mop bucket. Rinse floors with clean water after cleaning heavy soils.*

*To avoid sticky floors, if adding more cleaner for cleaning heavily soiled area, it is best to do a **clean water rinse**. After removing heavy soils, return to routine/daily cleaning at the normal concentrations listed above with no need to rinse after cleaning.*

Step 4: Place mop in solution and wet thoroughly.

Step 5: Twist mop in wringer and wring out as much solution as possible.

Step 6: Starting at the farthest point from the door, mop a 10 ft. by 10 ft. area.

Step 7: Move to the next 10 ft. by 10 ft. area, working towards the doorway and repeat Steps 4 through 7.

Tips

- Change mop bucket solution when it becomes dirty and after every use.
- Remove wet floor sign ONLY when the surface is thoroughly dry.
