

## Exhaust Hoods

**Products Needed:** Mr. Clean Professional Heavy Duty Degreaser

**Tools Needed:**

- Clean Towels
- Utility Bucket
- Non-Abrasive Pad
- Eye Protection

**Cleaning Frequency:** As needed(at least once a week)

**Preparation:** Review MSDS, products labeling and caution statements. Choose appropriate safety equipment.

**Special Directions for this Task:** Wear eye protection. If sensitivity to cleaning solutions is a concern, wear disposable gloves.

**Step 1:** Fill utility bucket with a warm solution of floor cleaner mixed as directed.

**Step 2:** Turn off exhaust hood, if applicable.

**Step 3:**

- Dip non-abrasive pad into the cleaning solution.
- Scrub interior and exterior of exhaust hood with non-abrasive pad, a small section at a time.

**Step 4:** Use clean towels to wipe each section clean and dry

**Step 5:** Dip non-abrasive pad in cleaning solution, and wipe down Ansul pipes.

***CAUTION:** Be careful not to trip Ansul Fire System.*

**Step 6:** Use clean towels to wipe pipes clean and dry.

**Step 7:**

- Remove light shields and cages.
- Wash and rinse the light shields/cages in the sink.
- Allow to air-dry.

**Step 8:** When they are dry, return light shields and cages to their proper locations.

**Step 9:** Check for any loose paint, chipped glass, or burnt-out lights; repair or replace.

**Step 10:**

- If used, remove and discard disposable gloves.
- Wash hands before returning to service area.

***Note:** For any tough greasy stains that remain following cleaning, touch up areas by cleaning with Mr. Clean Professional Heavy Duty Degreaser (spray and wipe)*
