

Restroom Cleaning Procedure

Products Needed:

- Mr. Clean Professional Disinfecting Restroom Cleaner
- Mr. Clean Professional Disinfecting Multi-Purpose Cleaner
- Mr. Clean Professional Disinfecting Cleaner with Bleach (optional)
- Mr. Clean Professional Glass Cleaner
- Swiffer Dusters with Extendable Handle
- Swiffer Sweeper with Dry Cloths

Tools Needed:

- Wet floor sign
- Toilet bowl brush
- Bounty paper towels; clean lint-free towels, or microfiber cloths
- Disposable gloves
- Bucket

Cleaning Frequency: This is determined by restroom conditions. These steps should be taken throughout the day as needed, and every evening.

Preparation: Review MSDS, products labeling and caution statements. Choose appropriate safety equipment.

Special Directions for this Task: Wear disposable gloves to help minimize contact with germs in the restroom facility.

Step 1: Close and Inspect

- Close restroom to pedestrian traffic.
- Put out wet floor sign.
- Put on disposable gloves.
- Check operation of lights and fans for malfunction.

Step 2a: Toilets / Urinals

- Flush toilets and urinals
- Spray Mr. Clean Professional Disinfecting Restroom Cleaner into bowl and under rim of bowls and urinals.
- Let stand while applying Mr. Clean Professional Disinfecting Multi-Purpose Cleaner onto exteriors of bowls and urinals, including handles and lids.
- **Let stand for 10 minutes to kill germs and eliminate odors.**

Note: If so desired, Mr. Clean Professional Disinfecting Cleaner with Bleach can be used **instead** of Mr. Clean Professional Disinfecting Restroom Cleaner on bleach-safe surfaces.

Step 2b: Tubs, Showers, Shower Walls and Shower Enclosures

- Spray Mr. Clean Professional Disinfecting Restroom Cleaner directly onto the surfaces to be cleaned.
- Spread product across entire surface.
- **Let stand for 10 minutes to kill germs, remove tough soils, and eliminate odors.**
- Scrub all surfaces with a towel or microfiber cloth.
- Rinse all surfaces with water. Begin rinsing at the top of shower wall and/or enclosure. Continue rinsing from top to bottom.
- Buff surface with a clean, dry towel.

Note: If so desired, Mr. Clean Professional Disinfecting Cleaner with Bleach can be used **instead** of Mr. Clean Professional Disinfecting Restroom Cleaner on bleach-safe tub and shower surfaces to clean and eliminate mold and mildew stains present.

Do **NOT** use Mr. Clean Professional Disinfecting Restroom Cleaner on natural marble.

Do **NOT** use Mr. Clean Professional Disinfecting Restroom Cleaner and Mr. Clean Professional Disinfecting Cleaner with Bleach at the same time as hazardous fumes may result.

Step 3: Sinks and Countertops

- Spray Mr. Clean Professional Disinfecting Multi-Purpose Cleaner onto sink surfaces.
- If using a cloth towel, rinse often in clean water.
- If using a paper towel, discard when it becomes soiled.

Note: For heavy stains, allow cleaner to stand for five minutes prior to wiping. **Let stand for 10 minutes to kill germs, remove tough soils, and eliminate odors.**

Step 4: Check and Refill (Allows proper contact time for disinfecting products to work.)

- Check and refill soap dispensers, paper towel dispensers, facial tissues, toilet seat covers, etc.
- Clean the exteriors of dispensers by spraying Mr. Clean Professional Disinfecting Multi-Purpose Cleaner and wiping dry with a paper towel.

Step 5: Toilets / Urinals

- Wipe exterior surfaces of toilets and urinals with a clean paper towel.
- Discard paper towel.
- Scrub all interior surfaces of toilets and urinals with a toilet bowl brush.
- After cleaning, flush toilet or urinal.

Step 7: Mirrors

- Spray Mr. Clean Professional Glass Cleaner onto mirrors.
- Wipe with a clean paper towel.
- Discard paper towel.

Step 8: Walls

- Spray Mr. Clean Professional Disinfecting Multi-Purpose Cleaner directly onto the walls, stall dividers, light switches, doors and door knobs.
- If using a cloth towel, rinse often in clean water.
- If using a paper towel, discard when it becomes soiled.

Step 9: Trash

- Discard trash in appropriate location, making sure that any liquid does not drip onto floor and cause a possible wet floor hazard.
- Follow the Trash Can Cleaning Procedure to clean cans as needed.

Note: Use extra caution when handling trash, as it may contain broken glass, liquids or waste from sanitary napkins or diapers.

Step 10: Dust and Sweep

- Use Swiffer Dusters with Extendable Handle to remove dust and cobwebs from tops of walls, doorways, stall partitions, lights, fans and other hard to reach areas.
- Use putty knife to remove gum from floors, stall partitions and other surfaces.
- Sweep entire floor surface to be cleaned with a broom or a Swiffer Sweeper with Dry Cloths.

Step 11: Floors

- To clean floors, follow the Damp Mop Procedure. To clean and disinfect floors, follow the Disinfecting Damp Mop Procedure.
- Remove wet floor sign ONLY when surface is thoroughly dry.

Step 12:

- If used, remove and discard disposable gloves.
- Wash hands before returning to work.

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
